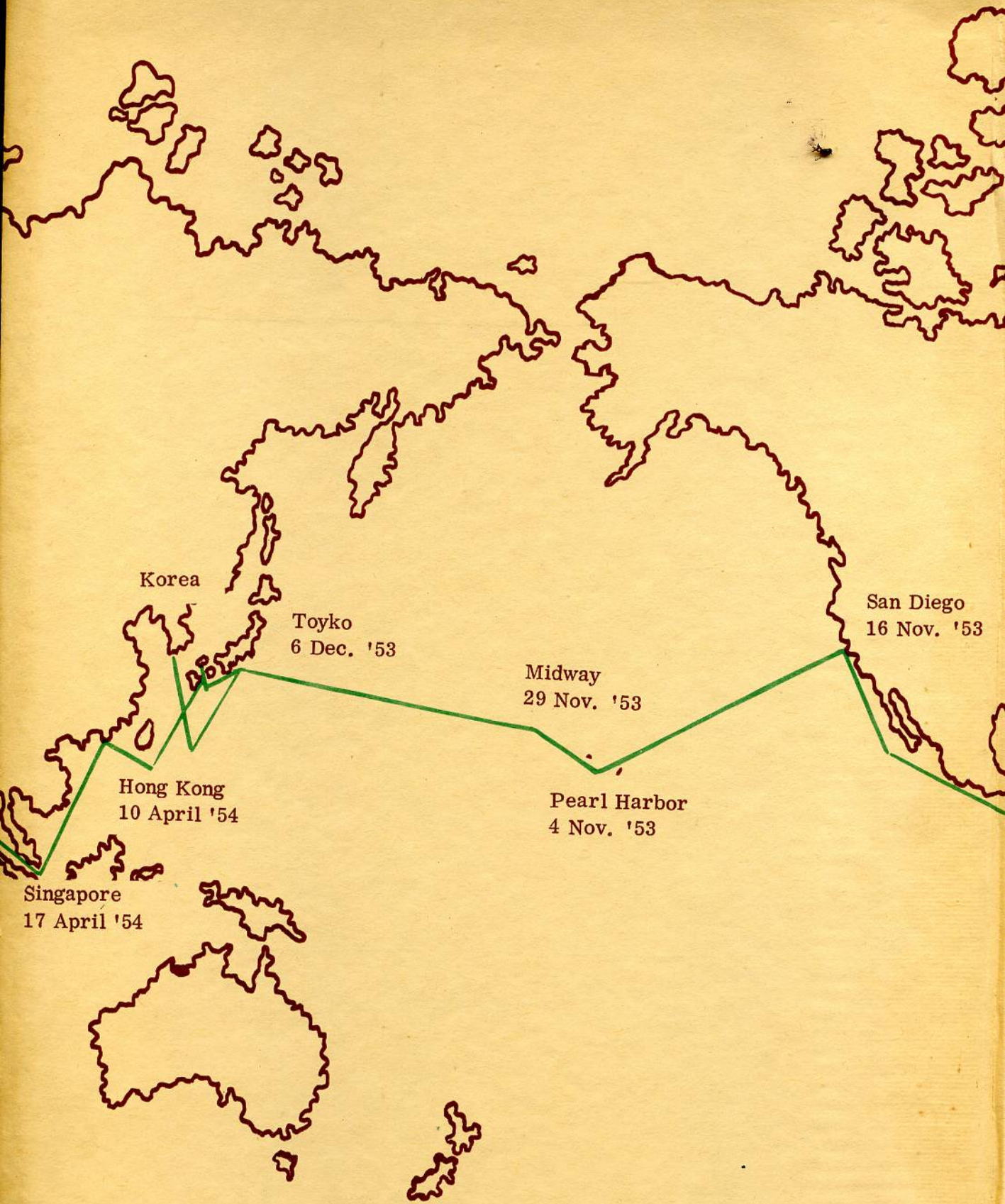

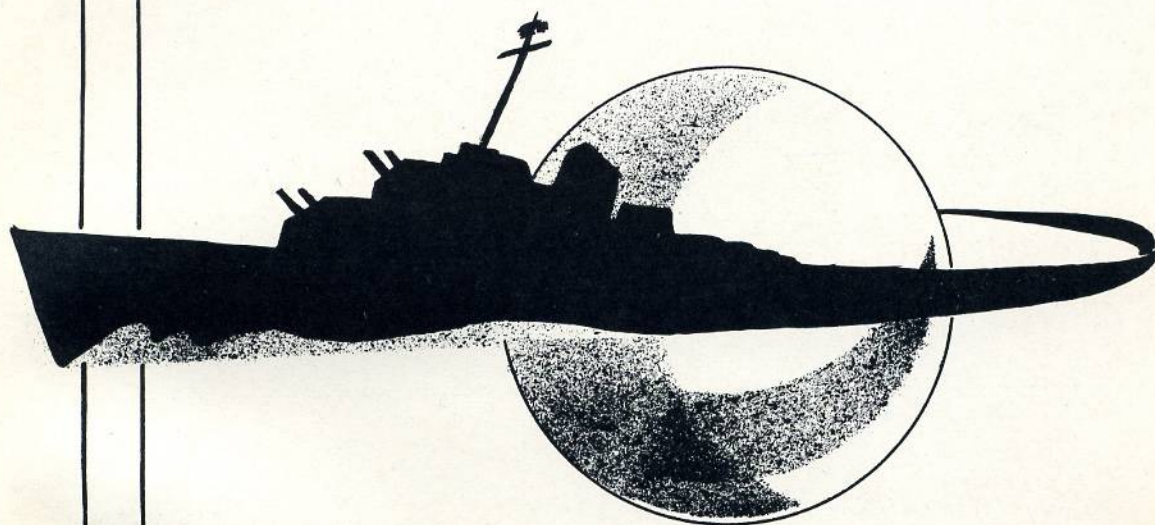

# COMMANDING OFFICER

Commander M. E. Vallario, USN, is a native of Pennsylvania having been born in Scranton on September 5, 1917.

After attending local schools, he entered the University of Scranton. He continued his education as a cadet in USS Annapolis, a training ship operated by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Upon graduation, he sailed in various merchant ships until his entry into the Naval Service in May 1941 as Navigator in USS Tippecanoe, a Fleet oiler.

Commander Vallario continued serving in various auxiliaries during the early part of World War II. He assumed his first command as captain of USS Raccoon in 1944.

Following the war, he served at the Bureau of Naval Personnel, the General Line School at Monterey, Calif., and on the staff of Commander Naval Forces, Far East. Commander Vallario took command of USS John W. Weeks on 30 October 1953.

Commander Vallario married the former Alice Flynn of Scranton in 1940. His wife and three children are now living in Philadelphia.

Lieutenant Commander Edmond L. Kelley, USN, was born in Utica, N. Y. on March 13, 1921. He entered the U.S. Naval Academy in June 1940 and graduated in June 1943.

After spending the remainder of World War II in destroyers, he became a member of the staff, Commander Destroyers Pacific Fleet. In 1948, Mr. Kelley entered the U.S. Naval Postgraduate School and then went to the Massachusetts Institute of Technology where he was awarded a Master of Science degree in Electrical Engineering in June 1951, after having completed studies in the field of Ordnance Engineering.

Following his work at MIT, he joined Guided Missile Unit #21 where he served until reporting to WEEKS on September 1, 1953.

Mr. Kelley married the former Miss Weslia M. Stafford of Easton, Md. in 1943. The Kelley's have three children and are currently residing in Norfolk, Virginia.
